2023-2024 Annual IRN Report School Segregation and Education Marketization

Dear Chair and Members of the International Research Networks Committee,

I am pleased to provide you with an annual report on the School Segregation and Education Marketization network. This letter includes our network objectives, activities, and future plans. Please let us know if you have any questions or feedback!

1. Objectives

Our network was renewed in May 2022 for two additional years. Our key objectives are to:

- mobilize research on school social segregation and make new and meaningful connections to education marketization and privatization;
- build and promote scholarly exchange among network members and between our members and other WERA members; and
- disseminate and promote knowledge mobilization of new and cutting-edge research of network members within the WERA association and beyond.

2. Activities

a. Book project

The network members are collaborating on writing a proposal for the World Yearbook of Education on the theme of school segregation and education privatization. We have had several meetings with the WYE editors in 2023. We have a draft of the proposal. Upon the request of the WYE editors, we are working on narrowing down the scope of the project and confirming the list of contributing authors. Our proposal will be resubmitted in September 2024. I will be able to provide an update next year.
