2. Regular meetings

We began our work in September 2023 with three working groups, divided according to their area of focus: 1. Skills; 2. Interventions and Programs; 3. Policy. In the first quarter of 2025, a new group focusing on The Integration of Numeracy and Literacy was created. The goal of the groups' work is to publish literature reviews on their respective topics.

Regular online meetings of the IRN working groups take place 1–2 times a month. On June 20 and November 14 2024, we held online meetings with the entire IRN. Each working group presented its progress and received feedback from members of the other groups. Questions related to search and screening strategies for conducting literature reviews were central to these meetings.

3. Publication of a Special Issue

In August 2024, a special issue on basic and language education for adults with low literacy skills was published in the *Journal for Research on Adult Education*. Four members of the IRN were invited to be guest editors of this issue, which includes articles by IRN members.
